# Watercoolers - ALIKE YET DIFFERENT



This collection is an example of some of the best work from the Red Wing Stoneware Co., circa 1880s. These magnificent salt glazed 5 gallon water coolers are alike but also distinctly different. The cobalt designs of the leaves and the butterfly was created at the height of the Red Wing Stoneware Co. popularity and were done by master artisans. There are three different treatments of the bung hole. The one on the far left has the hexagon with screws, the middle one does not have the hexagon bung hole and the right has the hexagon but placed at a different angle. These items are on display at the Red Wing Collectors Society Museum in the Pottery Mall.

#### TOWN & COUNTRY DINNERWARE: 0 F TIMELINE SHAPES AND COLORS (PART

The Red Wing Potteries introduced the Town and Country line of dinnerware, designed by Eva Zeisel, in 1947 (see Figure 1 pictured on bottom of page). The dinnerware line was a great success for Red Wing and has since been admired by museums and collectors. Today, Town and Country dinnerware is highly sought after and is considered to be a rare find. The rarity of Town and Country has led many collectors to believe that the line was produced for a very short period of time; rumors suggest possibly as short as one year. However, the line was actually in production for several years. This article will document the time line for the various shapes

and colors of Town and Country dinnerware using a collection of original documents and brochures from Red Wing Potteries.


Red Wing Potteries introduced Town and Country dinnerware with approximately 34 shapes and seven colors. The ergonomic and whimsical shapes included place setting pieces as well as marmites, casseroles, mixing bowls, cruets, soup tureens, lazy susans, condiment servers and more. Figure 2 (pictured on page 5) shows the shapes as portrayed in an original four-page brochure dated January 2, 1947. This is the earliest known documentation for the dinnerware line and the authors speculate that this is likely the first brochure for Town and Country.

According to a price list found on the back of the 1947 brochure (Figure 3 pictured on page 6), the initial colors of Town and Country were Chalk White, Dusk Blue, Sand, Metallic Brown, Chartreuse, Peach and Rust. Most shapes were available in all colors, but there are exceptions. For example, the covered casserole was not made in chalk white or metallic brown. By January of 1950, Red Wing Potteries had introduced Forest Green and Gray to the color

palette for Town and Country, and discontinued the White, Sand and Peach colors.

Figure 4 (pictured on page 6) shows the ever-popular salt and pepper shakers in all nine Town and Country colors. In addition to

Figure 1. Town and Country Dinnerware. 1






Figure 2. The shapes of Town and Country (1947 Brochure). 1

the color changes, the left and right-handed salad spoons, the ladle and the soup tureen were also discontinued. A price list from 1950 documents the changes (see Figure 5 pictured on page 7). There have been two versions of white glazing found on Town and Country dinnerware; one is a matte white and the other a glossy white. It is certain that Chalk White is the matte version, but the documentation shown does not indicate when the change to glossy white was made. Because Chalk White is such a hard color to find, the authors believe that the change to glossy white may have occurred within the first year and solid white pieces were discontinued entirely before the 1950 brochure was printed.

A price list dated April 20, 1953 (Figure 6 pictured on page 7) lists the same colors as the 1950 price list, and it documents the discontinuation of the coaster from the Town and Country line. A March 1, 1955 price list and color chart show no changes from the

1953 list, not even in the pricing (Figure 7 pictured on page 7).

A May 1956 letter to customers from the management of Red Wing Potteries outlined changes in availability for a number of dinnerware patterns including Town and Country

(Figure 8 pictured on page 7). This letter documents the final production run for the Town and Country line. It states that Town and Country was discontinued January 1, 1956, but orders would be accepted through the calendar year for two final production runs in July and December 1956. Orders received January 1, 1957 or later would be limited to available stock. Based on this letter, December 1956 marked the final production of Town and Country. Town and Country was in production for ten years, from 1947 through the end of 1956.

Most shapes in the Town and Country dinnerware line were available for the duration of the production period. However, the soup tureen, salad spoons, ladle and coaster were discontinued early. The salad spoons, ladle and soup tureen were in production for three years, and the coaster was produced for six years. The wooden lazy susan (Figure 9 pictured on page 16) was in production for ten years, although it is still a very rare piece.

There are many pieces of Town and Country in existence that are not listed in the documentation shown in this article, including the white and peach syrups, metallic brown mixing bowl and rust condiment spoon shown in Figure 10 (pictured on page 16). The possibility exists that these items could have been included in line changes for which the authors have not found documentation, or they may have been specially ordered. The documentation shown has gaps, three years between 1947 and 1950 and again from 1950 to 1953. Most likely the introduction of gloss white appears somewhere in these gaps, perhaps along with other line changes unknown to us at this time.

This article documents the timeline for the shapes and colors of Town and Country dinnerware using a collection of vintage documents and brochures from Red Wing Potteries. The documentation shown explains why some Town and Country colors and pieces are harder to find than others, but none of it explains why Town and Country pieces were made in the Quartette colors, typically found on the Concord shape. In Part 2 of this article, to be published in the next issue of the RWCS newsletter, the authors will document the non-original colors of Town and Country dinnerware.






